A new left turn inverts the direction: continue along this trail until you reach a vast grassy area known as **Sacche** (), with large beech trees along the left side. Following the main trail there are no more turns until you reach the payed road near Falzoie. From here the road heads downhill towards the settlements of Sòstare and Ferracini. Near the hairpin turn that wraps around Ferracini, continue straight eastward along the unpaved road that enters the woods. Following the indications at the forks, return to the cemetery of **San Rocco** and continue on to the village.

Walking up the road towards **Colletto**, turn immediately to the left of the cemetery and continue northward as far as the first fork. Turn right here and continue again on the municipal road to Colletto (to avoid the paved road). Head toward **Pròveste**, turn left and follow the unpaved road that leads to the meadows on the summit. From this point, continue along a trail (westward) that turns sharply to the right toward **Colletto**.




